Merely because Irfan is good in drawing neatly and accurately, he has

succeeded in coming up with simple and balanced compositions which abound in repetitively same romanticized shapes, looks and portraits of Buddha, most of them in outlines.

Another aspect of Irfan's watercolours work is that he is quite adept in simplifying images boxed into very average-looking

compositions. Light and subdued colours are also intelligently employed to achieve pleasant effect of so many Buddha variations and impersonifications.

These qualities have given a bright look to his exhibition which Citiart Gallery curator, Salim Ahmad has taken care to space his works in a befitting display.
